REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

IT IS notified for the general information of the public that the Cabinet Secretary for Education, pursuant to the provisions of section 8 of the Statutory Instruments Act, (Cap. 2A) has prepared a Regulatory Impact Statement on the impacts and likely impacts of the proposed Kenya National Qualifications Framework (General) Regulations, 2025 on stakeholders, members of the public and other persons likely to be affected by the proposed Regulations.

1. The proposed Regulations are the Kenya National Qualifications Framework (General) Regulations, 2025.

2. The proposed Regulations have been developed pursuant to section 29 of the Kenya National Qualifications Framework Act, (Cap. 214), and the main objective of the Regulations is to provide for—

- (a) National Qualifications Framework,
- (b) National Qualifications Database,
- (c) System for Credit Accumulation and Transfer,
- (d) Registration of Qualification Awarding Bodies and National Qualifications,
- (e) System for assessment, examination, and certification,
- (f) Alignment and validation of qualifications.

Any person likely to be affected by the proposed Regulations may submit a written memorandum on the proposed Regulations within fourteen (14) days from the date of this Notice.

THE VETERINARY SURGEONS AND VETERINARY PARAPROFESSIONALS ACT, 2011

CONFIRMATION OF ENTRIES IN THE 2025 KENYA VETERINARY BOARD REGISTERS FOR VETERINARY SURGEONS AND VETERINARY PARAPROFESSIONALS

PURSUANT to section 20 of the Veterinary Surgeons and Veterinary Paraprofessionals Act, all veterinary surgeons and veterinary paraprofessionals registered by the Kenya Veterinary Board (KVB) are notified that the relevant registers are ready for inspection to confirm the particulars as entered therein and allow for the registered persons to notify the Board on any anomalies detected therein.

Note: Persons whose names will not appear in the relevant registers after the 31st March, 2025, will be deemed not to be registered under the Act.
